



Government vessels Exemption 2012 (No.1)

I, Graham Peachey, Chief Executive Officer of the Australian Maritime Safety Authority, make this instrument under subsection 334(1) of the *Navigation Act 2012*.

1 Name of instrument

This instrument is *Government vessels Exemption 2012 (No.1)*.

2 Commencement

This instrument commences on 1 July 2013.

3 Definitions

In this instrument:

length, for a vessel, has the same meaning as in the *International Convention on Load Lines, 1966*, as amended by the *Protocol of 1988 relating to the International Convention on Load Lines, 1966*.

Note Other terms used in this instrument are defined in the *Navigation Act 2012*, including *Government vessel* — see subsection 14(1) of the Act.

4 Exemption of certain Government vessels

- (1) Each Government vessel in a class of vessels mentioned in an item in the following table is exempt from each provision of the *Navigation Act 2012* and Order made under the Act that is mentioned in the item.
- (2) The exemption is subject to the condition that the vessel must comply with *Marine Order 62 (Government vessels) 2003*.
